


Ocean Wave Quilt Blockette for September 2020

4 ½ " Center squares: **PLEASE NOTE THE INSTRUCTIONS SAY MAKE 4, YOU ONLY NEED ONE**

Nine Patch—Cut (4) O'S 1 ½" x 2" in a Bright Color, U's (4) 2" squares in Orange, & (1) Y 1 ½" square in Orange

Nine Patch Accent Block
Step 3: Combine [u], [o] and [y] as shown. Press toward the orange. Make (4) blocks.


Star Accent Block



Spool- (1) Z 2" square in Contrast Color, (2) N's 1 ¾" X 4 ½" Contrast Color, (2) T's 2" X 1 ¾" in Orange, (4) V's 1 ¾" squares on Orange
MAKE (4) BLOCKS.


Spool Accent Block
Step 2: Using SEW&FLIP method, sew [v] squares on opposite corners of [n]. Press out. Combine with [t] and [z] to create the Spool block. Make (4) blocks.

Nine Patch Accent Block




Churn Dash- (2) W's 1 ½" X 1 ¼" Bright Color, (2) S's 2 ½" Squares cut on the diagonal Bright Color, (2) K's 2 ½" Squares cut on diagonal in Orange, (4) L's 1 ½" X 1 ¼" in Orange, & (1) M 1 ½" Square in Orange

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS:
Churn Dash Accent Block
Step 1: Use [k] and [s] and make 4 HST. Trim to 2" pressing to the darker side. Combine with [L], [m], & [w] to make a Churn Dash Block.



Star Block- (12) X's 1 ½" Squares Bright Color, (1) P 2 ½" Square in Orange, (4) Q's 1 ½" X 2 ½" Squares in Orange, & (4) R's 1 ½" Squares in Orange

Star Accent Block
Step 4: Using SEW&FLIP, add [x] squares to opposite corners of [q]. Make (4) flying geese Units #1. Using SEW&FLIP, add [x] to (4) corners of a [p] square. Use Unit #1 & Unit #2 and [r] squares to form a Star Block. Make (4) Blocks.



Disregard where it says make 4 blocks, you only need one

Pumpkin- Orange (Pumpkin) Color: (2) A's 3" X 4 ½", (2) B's 2" X 5", (1) C 2" X 9 ½".
Solid Black Background: (2) D's 2 ½" X 4 ½", (2) E's 2 ¼" Squares, (2) F's 2" Squares, 1 G 1 ¼" Square.
Green Stem Color: (1) H 1 ½" X 2 ½", (2) I 1 ½" Square, (1) J 1 ½" Square



Pumpkin Assembly:

Stem Section

Step 5: Using SEW&FLIP, add matching [i] squares to pairs of [b] rectangles creating mirror images as shown. Press out. Note that (8) of your [i/b] pairs will be one grey print & (8) will be another. Sew pairs together for Unit #3. Press open.

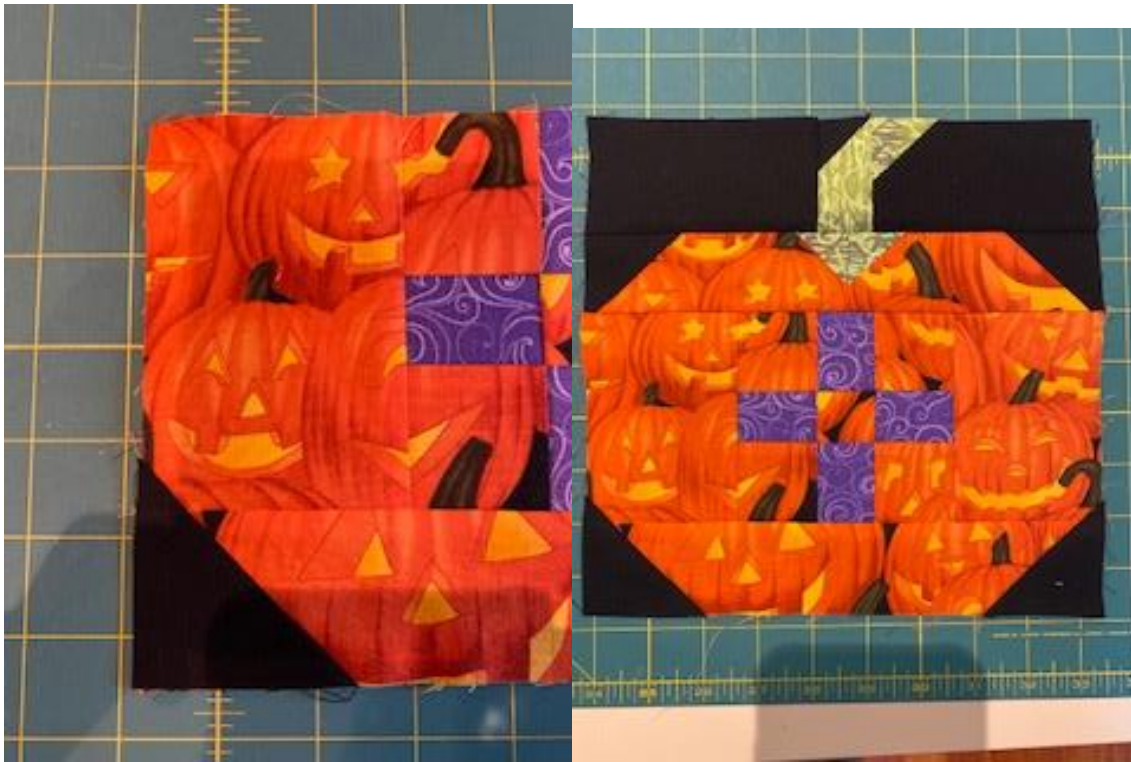
Step 6: Using SEW&FLIP, sew a [g] square to the top left corner of [h] rectangle. Press out. Make (16) Unit #4, (8) from each print.

Step 7: Using SEW&FLIP, sew a [j] square on an upper left corner of a [d] rectangle. Press out. Make (16) Unit #5.

Step 8: Join Units #4 and #5 together along with remaining [d] to create stem section. Unit #4 Press open and toward [d].

****Sew and Flip E Squares Last

NOTE: Your block should be 9½" square.



DIAGONAL "SEW & FLIP" METHOD

Step 1: The fabrics that will be sewn on top will need to have a diagonal line either drawn or pressed on them so that you have a sewing line. We use both methods interchangeably but many people have a favorite. Use an erasable pen like a "Frixion pen" [available in our shop & in many local quilt shops as well].

Step 2: Place the square on top of the background rectangle RST & sew it to the background piece on the diagonal line that you have pressed or drawn.

Step 3: Next, trim out all the excess fabric from the back of that piece and if necessary the background piece as well. If the background piece is light and the top is dark, we opt to keep the background intact as a foundation for accurate piecing; if the top is lighter and the bottom will show through, then you will need to cut out both. Leave an app. ¼" seam allowance when cutting.

Step 4: You will then press open the remaining fabric to form your triangle. Always press out toward the corner. You will repeat the same process as above for all the pieces that use this method. We use this method for flying geese, snowballs, sawtooth stars and many other block units.
