Just to change things up a bit, I would like to have two raffle baskets this quarter. The basket on the left has 7 FQ, 7 1/4 yd cuts, silicone iron rest, charm pack, duster, lint roller, scissors, tape measure, and a sewing light all in a very nice box with lid. The other basket is notions including a purple thang, 2 pincushions, pins, micro brushes, aurifil thread, bobbin buddies, 80/12 Microtex needles, between, a tape measure, and some additional thread in a nice plastic box.

However, the Board decided to schedule the August 8th meeting for the Senior Center. There were several reasons for this, among them:

1. We need to reestablish our presence at the Senior Center. We are their “test case” for groups meeting at the Center on days when staff is not present.
2. It is challenging for some of our members to meet outdoors, including those who are hearing-impaired or mobility-impaired.
3. Meeting outdoors makes it difficult for the Treasurer, Secretary, and other board members who have to deal with paper, money, etc.
4. Demonstrating the Block of the Month is extremely challenging if there is a breeze!
5. “Show and Tell” is also challenging outdoors – it is hard for everyone to see.

Safeguards will be in place for this meeting, including:

1. No member who has not provided a copy of her COVID card (or proof of a negative COVID test within the past 72 hours) will be permitted to attend the meeting. (This is a Senior Center rule.)
2. All members will be asked to RSVP if they plan to attend (and let us know if you are bringing a guest).
3. If you plan to invite a guest, they must also provide a copy of their COVID card to me at least 2 days prior to the meeting
4. The doors to the Senior Center will be locked 5 minutes prior to the start of the meeting. Members who come after that time will need to TEXT my cell phone (see address list) and come to the NORTH door of the Senior Center (by the Junior High School) to be let in through the doors there (these are the doors that are by the OLD Attic Thrift Store).
5. All tables and chairs will be cleaned before the meeting.
6. Hand sanitizer will be provided at the meeting room door.
7. Windows and the door in the room will be opened to provide good circulation. (We will be the only group meeting, so hallway noise should not be an issue.)
8. All members are asked to bring masks to wear; all should feel free to wear masks if that is their comfort level.
9. There will **NOT** be a food table at this meeting. You may feel free to bring your own beverage and snack. (If you have a commercially wrapped small treat to share, such as Dove chocolates, you may feel free to bring that.)
10. There will be a free table at the meeting, but the rule is that you must check the table before you leave – if your item(s) is still there, you must take it home with you.

**Thoughts from a visitor to our ‘On the Fence Quilt Show’.

THE ARTS – From Tia B.

Saturday, June 26, a group of Ocean Lakers snuggled up in one car (Have fun! Save energy! Carpool!!) and drove to the corner of Laurel and Harrison Street to view the “On the Fence Quilt Show” – an open-air art show of more than 100 quilted items, covering both sides of the chain-link fence surrounding the park and ranging in size from full-size bed quilts to small wall hangings. Quilt making has traditionally been community work, involving the sharing of scraps of cloth left from sewing clothes and active participation in quilting bees, gatherings where pieced ‘tops’ were stretched on a frame and then quilted by many hands. Shared work and shared stories. Of course, our local quilters could not gather during the pandemic . . . The predominance of smaller quilts and wall-hangings in the show resulted – perhaps – from pandemic isolation, but as isolation can trigger creativity, there were many interesting wall-hangings, including Linda W’s. three whimsical pieces, depicting Japanese women dressed in traditional kimono happily surfing on a blue blue sea, an image made me think of a dear friend, a poet, who left a traditional marriage (and fifty elaborate kimonos!) in Japan to emigrate, first to Hawai`i and then to Argentina, transforming her life from dutiful wife to world-class tango dancer . . . (before, of course, the enforced isolation and loneliness of the pandemic, so antithetical to tango.) She even learned to surf – wearing a bikini rather than a kimono!. Equally interesting were the expert full-size quilts of Cindi W., two of which found new homes in Ocean Lake Park, and Sherry W. of Ocean Lake Park created a sunny yellow and white ‘pandemic’ quilt dominated by circles, both in the printed cloth and in the quilting itself, the circles contrasting neatly with the hard edges of the double-plus quilt pattern. The circle of life . . . and light, conquering the darkness of 2020. Surprisingly, when Sherry folded over the bottom corner of the quilt to reveal the reverse, cheerful bees printed on the back fabric flew into view. Suddenly, for me, the plus signs on the front, alive with black and white circles, became honeycombs, recalling the sweetness and the friendliness of quilting bees. And, of course, reminding us all of the importance of bees in our environment. Did these fabric artists intend that their quilts suggest all that welled up in my mind-heart when I looked at them? Does that matter? The beauty – the wonder – of art is that it is dialogue, sometimes wordless dialogue but dialogue nonetheless, a bit like a river singing to the sky, trembling over rocks, cascading over cliffs, planting seeds on muddy banks. You never know when those seeds might sprout which wildflowers will grow.
