Tip of the Month

Straight of Grain in Quilting

The straight of grain (SoG) is important in most sewing endeavors. It is also important in quilting. On point quilts require the setting and corner triangles to be on the SoG. I think borders and binding should also be on the SoG, particularly if the quilt is to be a wall hanging. I must admit that I try to orient my piecing so that the majority of blocks run the same direction with the SoG running top to bottom of the quilt.
